We offer assessment appointments in Perth throughout the year, as well as visiting regional outreach clinics across Western Australia. This flexible model allows families to access support in a way that best suits their location and circumstances.

Our Services

We offer a variety of assessment packages tailored to your needs. These may explore areas such as:

- **Learning difficulties** (including dyslexia and dyscalculia)
- **Giftedness**
- **Attention and executive functioning** (ADHD traits)
- **Memory, processing Speed, and cognitive strengths**
- **Social Communication and emotional development** (Autistic traits)
- **Developmental concerns and delays** (including Intellectual disabilities)

How to access Assessments

Families can access assessments in two ways:

Perth Appointments

- Available throughout the year
- Flexible scheduling options
- Clinic-based sessions

Regional Outreach Clinics

- Available at selected times across the year
- Delivered in local communities
- Designed to improve access for families outside of Perth

If you're unsure which option is best for you, we can talk this through during your initial consultation.

How Assessments Work

Our assessment services are consistent whether you are seen in Perth or at a regional outreach clinic, allowing us to bring our expertise to various locations and making it easier for families to access our services.

Here's how it works:

1. **Initial Consultation:** We begin with a consultation (via phone or video call) to understand your current needs and determine the most appropriate assessment package.
2. **Scheduling:** Our team works with you to book your appointments in Perth or during our scheduled visit to your region.
3. **Assessment Session:** The psychologist will meet with you and/or your child to complete formal assessments. Some sessions may include school observations or multiple appointments.
4. **Report Writing:** We take time to review, score, and interpret the results, creating a comprehensive written report. Reports are usually completed within 4–6 weeks.
5. **Follow-Up Support:** A follow-up consultation (via phone or video) is offered to discuss the results and recommendations and to answer any questions you may have.

Information and Consent

At Flourish Assessment & Consultancy, we follow best practice and ethical guidelines for psychological assessments. Before proceeding, you will receive:

- A clear explanation of the assessment purpose, process, fees and your rights
- A chance to ask questions and discuss the limitations of the assessment process
- A consent form outlining what is involved and how information will be handled

What to Expect During the Assessment

- **Confidentiality:** All information is private and only shared with your written permission.
- **Duration:** Sessions vary depending on the package and assessment needs (1.5 to 6+ hours)
- **Participation:** You or your child may be asked to complete various tasks and activities designed to evaluate specific skills and abilities. You and your child's teacher may also be asked to complete some online forms.

Understanding the Limits of the Assessment

It is important to understand the scope and limitations of our assessment services:

- **No Guaranteed Outcomes:** While our assessments aim to provide a comprehensive understanding of you or your child's strengths and challenges, we cannot guarantee specific outcomes. The recommendations provided are based on the assessment results and are intended to guide you in supporting your child's development or understanding your own support needs and strengths.
- **Not a Crisis Service:** Our assessment service is designed for planned assessments and is not equipped to handle emergency or crisis situations. If you or your child are experiencing a mental health crisis or require immediate support, please contact local emergency services or a mental health crisis hotline.
- **Scope of Recommendations:** Our recommendations are based on the assessment findings and provide guidance on next steps. Implementation of these recommendations may require collaboration with other professionals, such as teachers, therapists, or medical providers.
- **Follow-Up Services:** While we offer follow-up sessions to support the implementation of recommendations, ongoing therapeutic or educational interventions may require engagement with local services and professionals.

Assessment Clinic - Fees and Charges 2026

The following packages are available through our Outreach Clinics. These are based on complexity rather than a specific diagnosis. All assessments include:

- Pre-assessment consultation (billed separately)
- Standardised assessment
- Parent/teacher/self-report questionnaires (if applicable)
- A written report
- A feedback session

Snapshot Assessment	Brief assessment and may include: giftedness, evaluation of cognitive profile (including intellectual disability), early screening, or review assessment of a previous diagnosis	1.5-2 hrs	\$980
Focussed Assessment	Single area of concern (for example, ADHD or dyslexia)	3-4 hrs	\$1900
Comprehensive Assessment	A deeper dive into developmental differences, where there are one or more areas of concern. (For example, autism, or a combination of ADHD and learning disorders).	5-6 hrs	\$2700
Complex Assessment	Complex assessments that evaluate multiple developmental areas and often completed in cooperation with other clinicians (for example, FASD or combined Autism/ADHD assessments)	6+ hrs	\$3400

Customised assessments combining elements of our standard assessment packages can also be developed upon request.

Funding Options

- **NDIS:** Suitable for self-managed or plan-managed clients (please check with your support coordinator, and prior written approval is needed before an assessment can be confirmed).
- **Private Health:** Some providers offer rebates; contact your fund to check.
- **Medicare:** Rebates may apply for autism assessments with a paediatrician or psychiatrist referral, and FASD assessments with a GP referral. GP or allied health referrals for autism assessments are not eligible for medicare rebates.

Fees are reviewed regularly and may change. Please contact us to confirm current rates prior to booking.

Which Assessment is right for me?

You don't need to decide on the assessment type yourself; we will guide you after the initial consult. But here's a quick overview of what each package is designed to offer:

Exploratory Assessment

A play-based or conversational session designed to explore early signs of neurodevelopmental differences, such as autism or ADHD. This is a gentle starting point, especially for younger children or when you're unsure whether a full assessment is necessary. You might be wondering:

- "Could my child's strong need for routine or meltdowns be signs of autism?"
- "Does my 4-year-old show enough markers for an ADHD or ASD diagnosis?"
- "Is it too early to tell if my child needs support at school?"

This option includes a brief summary report with recommendations and can be upgraded to a more complex assessment if required/indicated.

Snapshot Assessment

A short, targeted assessment for one specific, and brief, question. Useful for screening, review assessments, or clarity around a single concern. You might be wondering:

- "Is my child gifted?"
- "Is my teen eligible to apply for special examination arrangements?"
- "Do I need an updated report for university support?"
- "Is my child ready to start school next year?"

Focused Assessment

An in-depth assessment that investigates one primary area of concern. It includes full diagnostic tools and a comprehensive report. Ideal when the concern is clearly defined (e.g., attention, learning difficulties). You might be wondering:

- "Does my child have dyslexia?"
- "Do I have ADHD, and would diagnosis help me manage things better?"
- "Is my child's spelling difficulty part of a larger learning disorder?"

Comprehensive Assessment

A detailed assessment that looks across multiple areas of concern—for example, when there are combined challenges with learning, attention, and social development. Suitable for autism assessments, profiles with overlapping symptoms, or when a broad picture is needed to inform support. You might be wondering:

- "My child has already had a speech assessment—could this be autism?"
- "My child struggles with literacy and numeracy—could there be more than one learning disorder?"
- "I've always masked well socially—could I still be autistic?"

Complex Assessment

A high-level comprehensive assessment for clients with complex profiles, including combined autism and ADHD assessments, FASD, or unclear diagnostic histories. More time is allocated for testing, analysis, report writing, and collaborative consultation if needed. You might be wondering:

- "Is this autism, ADHD, or both?"
- "My child has a mix of learning and behavioural concerns that don't fit into one box."
- "I've had several diagnoses, but I still don't understand my brain and why things feel so hard."

**Please note: there may be a requirement to complete additional assessments with a developmental paediatrician, speech pathologist, psychiatrist or other allied health clinicians as part of a multi-disciplinary assessment approach and this will be discussed with you during the initial consultation.*
